

DIRECTIVE 2015 / 863 / EU RoHS III

Since 31 March 2015, the European Union amended the Directive 2015/863/EU. This directive, known as the "Restriction of the use of Hazardous Substances" (RoHS III), regulates the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment.

The RoHS Directive, which was implemented on 1 July 2006, restricts the use of 10 (ten) substances in products and equipment sold in European countries.

The 10 (ten) hazardous substances listed in this directive and their maximum permitted weight limits are the following:

lead	Pb	0.1%
mercury	Hg	0.1%
cadmium	Cd	0.01%
hexavalent chromium	Cr(6+)	0.1%
polybrominated biphenyls	PBB	0.1%
polybrominated diphenylethers	PBDE	0.1%
di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate	DEHP	0.1%
Butylbenzylphthalates	BBP	0.1%
dibutylphthalate	DBP	0.1%
diisobutylphthalate	DIBP	0.1%
